

ACTIVITY SHEET by Laura Courter The Lion and the Mouse

Art Form: Drama • Other: Literacy

DESCRIPTION:

Have some fun reading the Fable of The Lion and the Mouse. Learn to use your facial expressions (show your feelings with your face) and gestures (show your feelings or actions with your body) as you are hearing the story.

RECOMMENDED AGE(S):

4-8 year olds

WHAT YOU DO:

- 1. Read the Fable Out Loud
- 2. As you are reading the fable, decide where you might use facial expressions and gestures to show how the characters are feeling and what they are doing. (the lion was sleeping, the mouse crawled into the cave)
