Let us explore how an actor uses props. Props are objects that actors use on stage. They are generally small objects like a cup or a book.


RECOMMENDED AGE(S):

You can use ordinary household objects to make into props. Try it with the cup, and then search for other objects around your house and have some fun.

- 1. Pick up your cup:
 - a. Use your cup as a hat
 - b. Use it as a spyglass like a pirate looking for treasure.
 - c. Use it as fish swimming in the ocean.
 - d. What else can you make out of the cup?
- 2. Now, try it on your own. Find something around your house to use as a prop. Some examples include a dishcloth, a spoon, a paper plate or even an empty box! Use your imagination and create something new!
