# **Animal Vision Landscape**

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

Animals see the world differently than humans. Learn to draw landscapes depicting animal vision.



Fish see clearly underwater.
They can see red, green,
and blue.



Rats see things in slow motion, their vision is blurry, and they can't see red.



Insects have 1000's of visualreceptors and see only ultra violet, blue, and yellow. They can't see red.



Horses see only greys, yellow, and blue. They have a blind spot in front of their faces.
