

### DESCRIPTION:

Animals see the world differently than humans. Learn to draw landscapes depicting animal vision.



**Fish** see clearly underwater. They **can** see **red**, **green**, and **blue**.



**Rats** see things in **slow motion**, their vision is **blurry**, and they **can't** see **red**.



**Insects** have 1000's of visualreceptors and **see only ultra violet**, **blue**, and **yellow**. They **can't** see **red**.



**Horses** see only **greys**, **yellow**, and **blue**. They have a **blind spot** in front of their **faces**.
