Art Form: Visual Arts • Other: Creative Writing

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

The sisters in Little Women have very different passions and paths that take them in different directions as they grow up. For example, Jo dreams of becoming a novelist. ## **MATERIALS NEEDED:**

- Magazine pictures
- TIME TO COMPLETE:

20-45 minutes

- Cut-out letters
- Stickers
- Journal or notebook

## WHAT YOU DO:

- 1. Make a list of things that interest you that you would like to learn about or explore.
- 2. Add other things to your list like words that inspire you such as adventure or tranquility.
- 3. Think about goals you are working towards and list them
- 4. Decide what medium you would like to use for your Vision Board so that you will know how to begin to collect illustrations or photographs.
- 5. Sort through or search for illustrations that make a good match for your goals, hopes, and dreams and start to cut them out or save them to a file on your laptop.
- 6. Make final decisions on what you want to include on your Vision Board and begin arranging them.
- 7. Once you have completed your board put it somewhere where you can see it every day to remind yourself of all the good things to come in your life.
